Our role is to encourage the young women through one-on-one conversation, to listen to their dreams and circumstances, and to share the experience of college and its benefits.

AAUW in Prescott began Sister-to-Sister10 years ago. It is one of the students' favorite ETS workshops. It is also one of the favorite activities for AAUW members.

Scholarship Fundraising:

Authors' Luncheon-

On Saturday, August 23, the AAUW Prescott Scholarship Committee hosted Presenting Arizona Authors, an authors' luncheon benefitting the Prescott AAUW Centennial Scholarship Fund. An estimated \$6,000 to \$7,000 was raised to benefit the fund, increasing the fund by almost 50%. The event was attended by 100 guests, both AAUW members and community supporters. *Major sponsors for the event included Blue Cross Blue Shield of Arizona, the Salt River Project, the Kathy, Larry, and Gretchen Lopez Family, Elaine and Bob Lawson, Fann Environmental LLC, Allegra Print and Imaging, and food service volunteers by Yavapai College Service Club.*

Local authors, Lisa Schnebly Heidinger, Susan Lang, and Susan Lanning each spoke about their writing and their books. They signed copies of their books purchased at the luncheon. Limited edition Gretchen Lopez prints and greeting cards were available for purchase and the Gretchen Lopez painting "Young Alaskan Girl" was purchased in a silent auction. Drawings were held for festive gift baskets provided by AAUW members and interest groups, including gift certificates from local merchants, and a \$25 gift card from Peregrine Book Company in Prescott was awarded as the door prize. Guests were treated to a light lunch.

The AAUW Centennial Scholarship will be awarded for the *first* time this fall to a female student who has completed at least one semester at Yavapai College and has earned a GPA of 3.0 or higher, preferably with a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering or Math) curriculum. Before the Authors' Luncheon, the AAUW Centennial Scholarship Fund balance was \$13, 242.83. The AAUW Prescott Scholarship Committee hoped to increase the fund balance to \$20K with proceeds from the Authors' Luncheon.

AAUW Prescott extends special thanks to the interest groups who provided delightful baskets for opportunity drawings and also to Kathy Lopez and her family for gifting a substantial portfolio of Gretchen Lopez art work to benefit the AAUW Centennial Scholarship Fund. The AAUW Centennial Scholarship Fund has been built on the support of many generous members of AAUW Prescott. Jean Morin is the new Geocaching Interest Group



Printing the AAUW Home Page Calendar

You may have noticed that, beginning with the July-August issue, the Thumb Sketch has discontinued the calendar pages.
