Our AAUW Members are volunteering their time and making a difference in the quality of life in the greater Prescott area. **Thank you** to those members that participated in our volunteer survey. Here are a few highlights from the respondents:

- Average number of hours per month per volunteer is 21
- 60% volunteer at more than one location
- 15% volunteer at four or more locations
- 2 members responded they volunteer over 80 hours each month

targeted at girls and boys, 8th grade through high school. We expect more students this year and are hoping for around 80 students.

At The Reality Store®, students select a career. Then they learn the monthly salary of that job. They enter "The Reality Store" where they will spend their salary by making choices on housing, clothing, car, and much

more, that they envision as part of their adult lifestyle. This event helps students learn the real cost of living and whether their chosen occupation would provide the type of lifestyle they expect and want. If not, what could they do differently? Stay in school? Many of you helped "man" the event previously and offered feedback for improvements, much of which we are implementing. On the evaluations, everyone said they really enjoyed interacting with the students and had a great time!

We are calling out for help in September and don't have much time to gather volunteers. "**The Reality Store**" is **Thursday, September 13, at 8:00 a.m. to around 1:00, in the Yavapai College Performing Arts Center.** Details will follow in an email to those who volunteer.

Each volunteer will be assigned to a specific task and trained in advance on what she need to do.
